Austin, Tex., Aug., 15-The total scholastics was found to be 914,000, making the total apportionment aggregate \$6,169,500, the largest in the history of Texas, both as to per capita and total. Last year the apportionscholastics and a total allowance crease of 75c for each child, 21-159 more children and an increase of \$808,854 in the total apportionment.

The State Automatic Tax Board reduced the State school tax rate today from 20c to 16 2-3c on the \$100 valuation, it being estimated that it would yield at least \$3,199,000 to the available school fund. In addition to that the Controller submitted his estimate of income to the funds from other sources, as follows: interest on bonds held by the permanent fund \$600,000, occupation taxes \$312,000. insurance \$80,000, gross receipts tax \$90zed counties \$4,500, estimated total \$2,842,000.




