A most dastardly attempt was made Tuesday night to wreck a train-in all probability the passenger-within almost a stone's throw of Marfa. A miracle, apparently, and nothing else, saved a frightful wreck and probably two or three lives. Wednesday morning when the section gang went out east of town, just at the yard limits, they discovered that the spikes had been drawn from a rail and a bolt taken out of the fish plates. The tools used were found under a small bridge only a few rail lengths from where the treacherous work had been done. The rail had been moved just a little in order that it would not be noticed by the engineer. This piece of cussedness had evidently been perpetrated early the night before and it is supposed the intention was to wreck passenger train No. 19. The rail showed indications that the passenger and probably four or five freights had passed over it, as the edges on the ends were cut from being out of place. The fact that one spike remained, which the scoundrel had tried to draw and could not, probably saved the train. It was on the high embankment just around the hill and the engine would probably have turned over and and the train fallen on top of it. It sincerely to be hoped that the party or parties who perpetrated this foul deed will be captured and severely dealt with. There is no telling how many innocent lives might have been lost had the intention of the wreckers been realized.—Marfa New Era.
