"Mother's Day"
Somewhere in France
Somewhere in Franc May 121918
"Dear Father, Sister and Brother. - Today is the day for al soldiers to write home. I am not feeling very well, but I ma going to wriie just the same.
"Dad this certainly is a beautiful country. Everything has greened up and everyone over here doing their bit.
"Dad I certainly would like to see you all. It seems to me like I have been away from home 10 years.
"I am still driving for the same Colonel and getting plenty to eat.
'This is Sunday morning and the old church bells are ringing. It brings about many thoughts just to sit here and listen to them.
'I will sure be glad when the time comes for us to roll our packs and mount the old boats back home.

## Luminous Paint Useful. Many ingenious ases have been found

of late for luminoús paint. Watches
with dials which glow in the darkness are becoming common, and only the
other day an order was given for 100 ,000 marching compasses with luminous needles to be carried by soldiers nt
the front. Immense quantities of lum. inous cloth are used by the soldiers
who go over the top. It is cut into small rectangles about ten inches long and fastened to the collars of the uni-
forms. The soldiers can thus recos. nize their own men in an indiscrimi-
nate fight in the dark. The luminous paint is also smeared on the end of
sharpened sticks which, when stuck into the ground, make a fairly clear
beacon. Luminous tape is also used by the mile for a rariety of purposes.

been found that on a dark night the luminous paint is visible for only 60
feet. A soldier can dip his hand in the paint and signal by describing letters
in the air or by wigwagging, knowing that the enemy cannot see him a hun-
dred feet away.
