### Kill And Ship Rabbits

The poor and needy folks of Fort Worth will eat rabbits this week at Odell citizens expense. As something near six hundred rabbits, most of them being the "Molly Cotton Tails", were killed in the enclosure of the Round Timber Ranch Wednesday by Odell sportsmen.

The rabbits were shipped to Fort Worth, and according to arrangements between W. W. Matthews of this place, and E. T. Tyra mayor of the Panther City, are to be distributed among the needy in the city. Who can fry them, bake them, use them in hash, or any manner they see fit, as the rabbits are theirs—a free gift of Odell citizens.

That the rabbits will be welcomed as a food provision in many of the Fort Worth homes, is assured by the reading of a communication from the Fort Worth mayor to W. W. Matthews, the letter states:

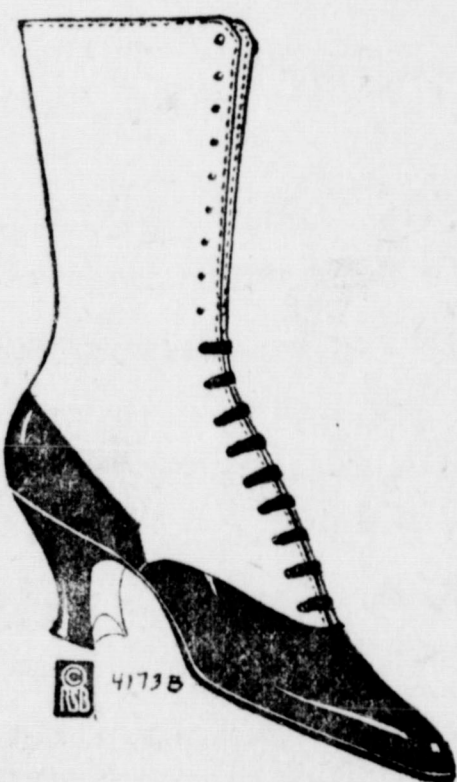
