This double tank should be placed near an outdoor pump where the compartments can be easily filled with water, Being exposed on all sides, the water will freere in from on to three bours. A bucket full of hot water poured into the space between the two tanks will loosen the cakes so that they may be removed. One freezing will give five cakes of ice each weighing 120 pounds. Fourteen freezings will yield four tons of pure ice, or enough to last an average family for a year. The bakes of ce can be backed away in sawdust in the cellar as they are frozen.
