A copy of these Bills by Harley Sadler, certified by the Secretary of State, has been mailed to each County Judge in the 24th Senatorial District. We suggest that you examine these Bills to verify the truth of the above statements.

The issue between these two candidates is clear. Senator Bullock opposses additional taxes. Mr. Sadler tried to tax the necessities of life.
