TO RECEIVE PIGS

On May 10, 1947 at the Clyde school, the 4-H boys whose essays were judged best by Fred Farmer, Eula 4-H Club leader, and H. E. Baldrige, Jr., Denton 4-H leader will receive registered Duroc Jersey gilts, also the 4-H boy and FFA boy selected to receive the pigs given by the Callahan County Luncheon Club of Baird, will be awarded at this time.

In connection with the awarding of the gilts, there will be a demonstration on vaccination of swine for the prevention of hog cholera with the new vaccine B.T.V., and all adults interested are requested to be present Saturday afternoon.

The 4-H boys to receive pigs are: Tommie Millhorn, Douglas Britton, Royce Dean Pringle, Winford Wayne Gardner, and Donald Ray of the Eula 4-H Club; and Milton Stewart, Harold Caddell, and Jimmy Hicks of the Clyde 4-H Club; and Robert Armour of the Denton 4-H club.

Jack Eli McKee, Eula 4-H boy, and one of the Baird FFA boys will receive the pigs given away by the Callahan Luncheon Club of Baird.

A POUND OF PREVENTION

A pound of DDT is worth 2000 pounds of beef to Callahan fly season this year. Often the treatment holds flies in check for months, but a heavy rain can mean the job needs re-doing after a 10-day period. Spray for more beef!

Control Of Bean Bugs Promised By All-Purpose Poison

This year, for the first time, Texas vegetable growers can have an all-purpose poison that promises to control all the major insects and diseases that hit snap beans.

The remedy, says Entomologist Paul Gregg, of the Texas A. and M. College Extension Service, is merely a new mixture of three already well-known materials—DDT, rotenone and sulphur. Proportions of the mixture are one part three percent DDT, one part of one half of one percent rotenone and two parts sulphur. The DDT kills leafhoppers and beetles, including the black-spotted mahogany-colored bean beetle that feeds on the plant

leaves; the rotenone gets plant lice; and the sulphur controls the disease, powdery mildew.

Recommended time for dusting the mixture is two weeks before the beans bloom, says Gregg, followed with a second application when the bean pods are formed. It cuts down danger of trouble caused by poisonous residue left

on the crop.

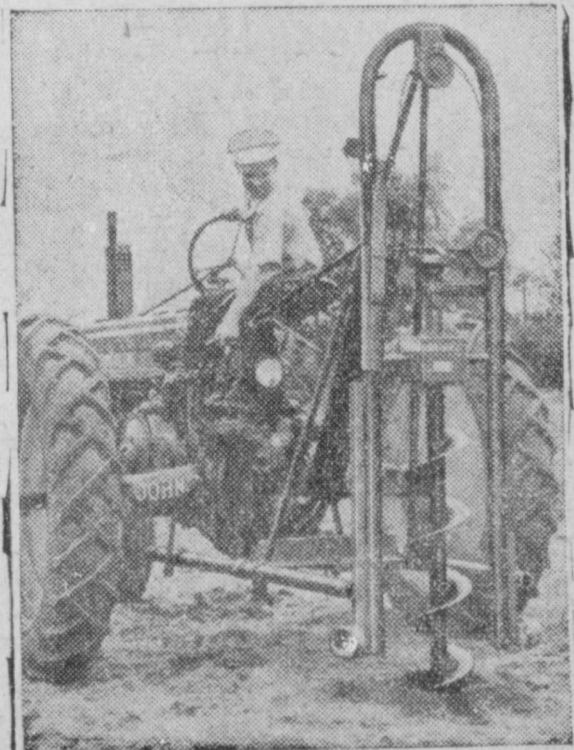

Great in life, he was surprisingly great in death. For no cause, in the very frenzy of wantonness and wickedness, by the red hand of murder, he was thrust from the full tide of this world's interest, from its hopes, its aspirations, its victories, into the visible presence of death—and he did not quail. Not alone for one short moment in which, stunned and dazed, he could give up life, hardly aware of its relinquishment, but through days of deadly languor, through weeks of agony that were not less agony because silently borne, with clear sight and calm courage he looked into his open grave.

What blight and ruin met his anguished eyes, whose lips may tell—what brilliant, broken plans, what baffled, high ambitions, what bitter rending of sweet household ties! Behind him a proud, expectant nation, a great host of sustaining friends, a cherished and happy mother, wearing the full, rich honors of her early toil and tears; the wife of his youth, whose whole life lay in his; the little boys not yet emerged from childhood's day of frolic; the fair young daughter; the sturdy sons just springing into close companionship, claiming every day and every day rewarding a father's love and care; and in his heart the eager, rejoicing power to meet all demands. And his soul was not shaken.

His countrymen were thrilled with instant, profound and universal sympathy. Masterful in his mortal weakness, he became the center of a nation's love, enshrined in the prayers of a world. But all the love and all the sympathy could not share with him his suffering. He trod the wine-press alone. With unflinching front, he faced death. With unflinching tenderness, he took leave of life. Above the domineering hiss of the assassin's bullet, he heard the voice of God. With simple resignation, he bowed to the Divine decree.

As the end drew near, his early craving for the sea returned.
