Camera, the mascot of the 36th Division who arrived in the US as a stowaway, recently joined his friend Claren Thompson, a veteran of the Texas division, at Waxahatchie, Tex. Senate Case Bill Varies Greatly From Original

WASHINGTON, March 12. (AP)—A new labor disputes measure emerged from a special Senate drafting committee today bearing only incidental resemblance to the Case bill passed by the House. Senator Ellender (D-La.), one of seven who helped write the substitute, told newsmen the main idea is to shift most strike settlement work from the Labor Department to a new "independent federal mediation board."

Although noting that the Senate group discarded most major provisions of the House bill sponsored by Rep. Case (R-SD), Ellender said he believed the Senate plan would encourage industrial peace. Chairman Murray (D-Mont) of the Labor committee, who headed the drafting group, said he would have a statement on the Senate bill later today. He previously had termed the Case bill "drastic."

The substitute measure now must go to the full Labor committee for possible changes before it reaches the Senate, where its fate and form are uncertain. Keystones of the new bill is the proposed federal mediation board which would be composed of five \$12,000 a year members appointed by the President subject to Senate confirmation. Congress Takes Up Use Of Ships In Atom Test

WASHINGTON, March 12. (AP)—Admonitions against disposing of any part of the United States fleet until permanent peace is assured echoed in the House today as members debated bills involving some 370 ships. Approximately 100 of the vessels, four of them battleships, have been earmarked as "guinea pigs" in the forthcoming atomic bomb tests at Bikini in the Marshall Islands. Their original value has been estimated at \$400,000,000, but most now are classed as obsolete. Nevertheless congressional approval for their use in the tests must be granted. The remaining 271, all surplus smaller ships, will be sold, leased or given to China if the legislation becomes law. They are intended as the nucleus of a new Chinese navy. Several hours of debate yesterday failed to produce a vote on the atomic bomb bill. Reps. Thompson (D-Tex) and Jed Johnson (D-Okla) opposed the measure on the ground that its consideration should be delayed until the peace of the world is more secure. Recalling that the United States sank part of its navy after the last war and then had to rebuild it to fight again, Johnson called the legislation "absurd" and "ridiculous." Thompson told his colleagues it would be "foolish" to destroy part of the US fleet "in view of present world conditions when everybody thinks we're going to have another war with a great power."

Unrecognized Indonesian Premier Reorganizes 12-Member Cabinet

BATAVIA, March 12. (AP)—Premier Sjahrir of the unrecognized Indonesian republic announced today formation of a new cabinet composed of 12 members of his old government and four newcomers, virtually all of whom were regarded as sympathetic to his publicly-proclaimed policy of moderation. At the same time authoritative sources said Sjahrir would resume negotiations with Dutch officials within 48 hours, with Sir Archibald Clark Kerr, special British envoy, presiding over the conference. The Dutch have offered the Indonesians commonwealth status with a promise of ultimate independence. Sjahrir's new cabinet contains only one member of the original government formed last year by President Soekarno—Amir Sjardjuddin, minister of internal security. Two of the newcomers are from the Moslem League and one of the new appointees is a woman—Dr. Ulfah Santose, former official in the foreign affairs ministry who took the portfolio of social affairs.
