The general topic for discussion when any huddle of people get together is the high prices, inflation and who is responsible. It appears that any one who is posted on current affairs could easily locate the responsibility.

Even in Washington thel are wanting to investigate the cause of the advance in prices of commodities. It should be plain to anybody what is boosting prices. Since we started the program of scarcety about 14 years ago prices of all labor and commodities have been boosted the limit by government props. Speculation at the present time has nothing to do with high prices in food stuff. The main couse. Did not the present administration recomend a wage boost for industry about one year ago when we were aflicted with a wave of strikes. He said at that time wage raises could be made without any rise in prices. On top of that the country has been on a spree of buying and shipping to foreign countries and giving the stuff away for its presentation May 1 and 2. Ignoring wholly the part played by the administration in encouraging wage increases after V-J day, the administration now states business is responsible for the high prices to the American people and that wage earners will be justified in asking for increased wages.

Just at a time when the country needs to eliminate politics and governmental interference with natural laws, the administration in wages. This is just a starter for another campaign of the present ad-

When the present administration talks about business and business men and what their responsibility is to increase prices, it chooses to omit all references to the high cost of labor and materials which have forced up the prices of manufactured goods. Spokesmen for business groups were quick to point to the figures as showing that, while manufacturing prices have gone up .75 per cent, agricultural to be held in 1948. Grand champion prices have advanced 180 per cent and raw materials 135 since 1939. Also it was pointed out that average hourly earnings in manufacturing plants have increased 85 per cent since 1939 and a large part of the rise was approved by the administration in Washington.




