





Cox, State Health Officer, has made an appeal to all parents to have their children undergo a through physical examination before entering school next

The appeal was made to coincide with the announcements of the various opening dates of schools throughout the state.

"It is a medically established fact that a child's health has a direct bearing on his progress in school," the health officer said. "It is no longer sufficient to provide the child with books and new fall clothing. Today we realize the health factor must be considered if the child is to reach his optimum

Dr. Cox said that since the child spends most of his time indoors with large groups of children, it is imperative that he be immunized when such protection is possible The spread of such diseases is facilitated in conjested classrooms.


