H. D. Agent's Column

Conference and 4-H Round-Up Postponed

The Extension Agents Conference and 4-H Club Round Up scheduled in College Station the week of August 16 through 20 has been postponed until June 13 through 17 next year, J. D. Prewitt, acting director of the Extension Service has announced.

Replacing the annual Agent's conference and 4-H Round-Up this year will be a series of bi-district extension meetings of two days duration in the latter part of October and the early part of November.

Plans for the bi-district meetings are tentative at this time, but a general program for all meetings places has not been decided, but geographic location involving the least amount of travel will be a determining factor, said Prewitt.

Keep Them Blooming

Would you like to keep your crepe myrtle blooming several weeks longer?

Sadie Hatfield, extension landscape gardening specialist of Texas A&M College, says three things will do the job: cutting the faded blooms, plenty of moisture and fertile soil. As soon as the blooms begin to fade, cut them off. If seed are formed they will take food from the plant, which otherwise would go into new blooms.

Veterans' News

Thousands of World War II veterans may lose the opportunity to reinstate National Service Life Insurance worth many millions of dollars unless they act before August 1, the Veterans Administration says.

After July 31, veterans whose NSLI term policies have been lapsed more than three months must take physical examinations to qualify as insurable risks. Before August 1, veterans have only to sign a comparative health statement.

Eligible veterans may reinstate any amount of term insurance up to \$10,000 in multiples of \$500 regardless of the length of time it has been lapsed under present liberal regulations if they apply before August 1.

They need only fill out a simple application form, in which they certify that their health is as good as when the policy lapsed, and pay premiums for two months.

Authority of the Veterans Administration to provide automobiles or other conveyances for veterans of World War II who in service lost, or lost the use of one or both legs at or above the ankle, has been extended until June 30, 1949.

The law granting vehicles to such disabled veterans had been scheduled to expire June 30, 1948. The extension and an appropriation of \$1,500,000 for the program were contained in the Second De-

ciency Appropriation Act for 1948.

A veteran who qualifies is entitled to an automobile or other conveyance costing not more than \$1,500, including such special equipment or appliance as may be necessary to enable him to operate the vehicle safely.

H. L. R. No. 24
HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an Amendment of Section 1-a of Article VIII of the Constitution of Texas to provide that no ad valorem tax shall be levied for State general revenue purposes after January 1, 1951, and authorizing the several counties to levy additional ad valorem taxes for certain purposes, providing for a Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) residential homestead exemption, and providing for tax levies in counties having tax donations; providing for submission to the qualified electors and for the necessary proclamation by the Governor.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 1-a of Article VIII of the Constitution be amended so as to be read as follows:

"Section 1-a. From and after January 1, 1951, no State ad valorem tax shall be levied upon any property within this State for general revenue purposes. From and after January 1, 1951, the several counties of this State are authorized to levy ad valorem taxes upon all property within their respective boundaries for county purposes, except the first Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) value of residential homesteads, not to exceed thirty cents (30c) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) valuation, in addition to all other ad valorem taxes authorized by the Constitution of this State, provided the revenue derived therefrom shall be used for construction and maintenance of Farm to Market Roads or for Flood Control, except as herein otherwise provided."

"Provided that in those counties or political subdivisions or areas of the State from which tax donations have heretofore been granted, the State Automatic Tax Board shall continue to levy the full amount of the State ad valorem tax for the duration of such donation, or until all legal obligations heretofore authorized by the law granting such donation or political subdivisions have been fully discharged, whichever shall first occur; provided that if such donation to any such county or political subdivision is for less than the full amount of State ad valorem taxes so levied, the portion of such taxes remaining over and above such donation shall be retained by said county or subdivision."

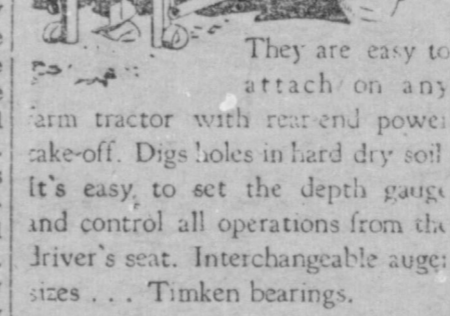

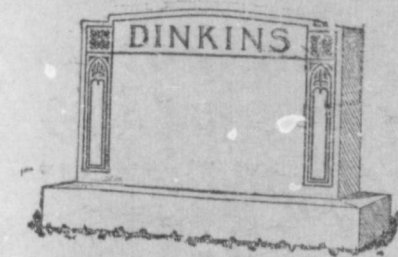

Have Children Take Examination Before Starting To School

With the report of 77 new cases of chicken pox, 11 cases of diphtheria, 320 cases of measles, 75 cases of polio, and 199 cases of whooping cough occurring in the state in the week between July 10 - 17, Dr. George W. Cox, State Health Officer, has made an appeal to all parents to have their children undergo a thorough physical examination before entering school next month.

The appeal was made to coincide with the announcements of the various opening dates of schools throughout the state.

"It is a medically established fact that a child's health has a direct bearing on his progress in school," the health officer said. "It is no longer sufficient to provide the child with books and new fall clothing. Today we realize the health factor must be considered if the child is to reach his optimum level."

Dr. Cox said that since the child spends most of his time indoors with large groups of children, it is imperative that he be immunized against communicable diseases when such protection is possible. The spread of such diseases is facilitated in congested classrooms.

He said the examination should include a dental check-up and inspection of the eyes, ears, nose and throat. The best health insurance for any child is constant supervision by the family physician and dentist.

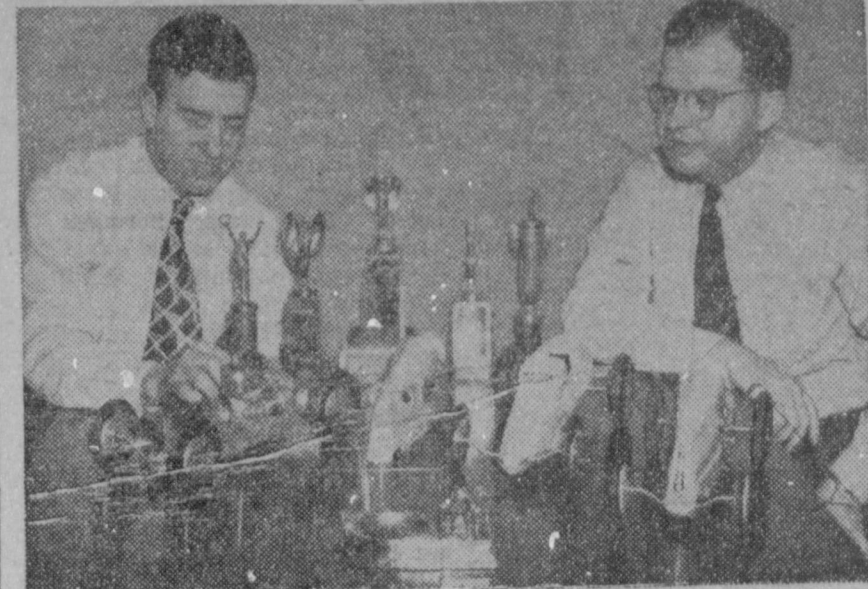

MINIATURE RACING IS NEW SPORT



Miniature auto racers that top 100 miles-per-hour are the latest creations of mechanical craftsmen and the once spare-time hobby has grown into a new sport that engages attention from coast to coast. R. J. Verville and W. J. Ringle of the Canton office engineering department of The Timken Roller Bearing Company are two of the miniature racing enthusiasts. The men are shown with models of their cars and a number of trophies won in competition.

The cars, with an average weight of five and one-half pounds, are precision built from the builder's own design. They are powered with the latest and finest miniature motors that hit 14,000 rpm when the car travels at 100 mph. Since weight and friction are constant problems in attaining higher speeds, Verville and Ringle, both so familiar with bearings through their work with Timken, have installed five anti-friction bearings on the cars and three in the motors.

The world speed record for a car of this type now stands at 125 miles per hour. Tracks used are concrete ovals 75 feet in diameter.

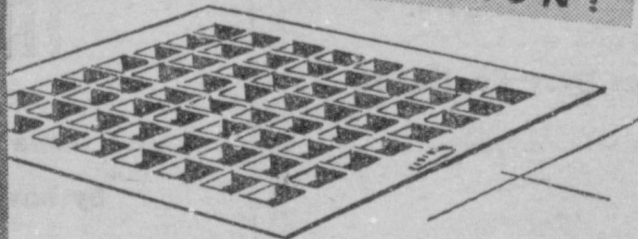

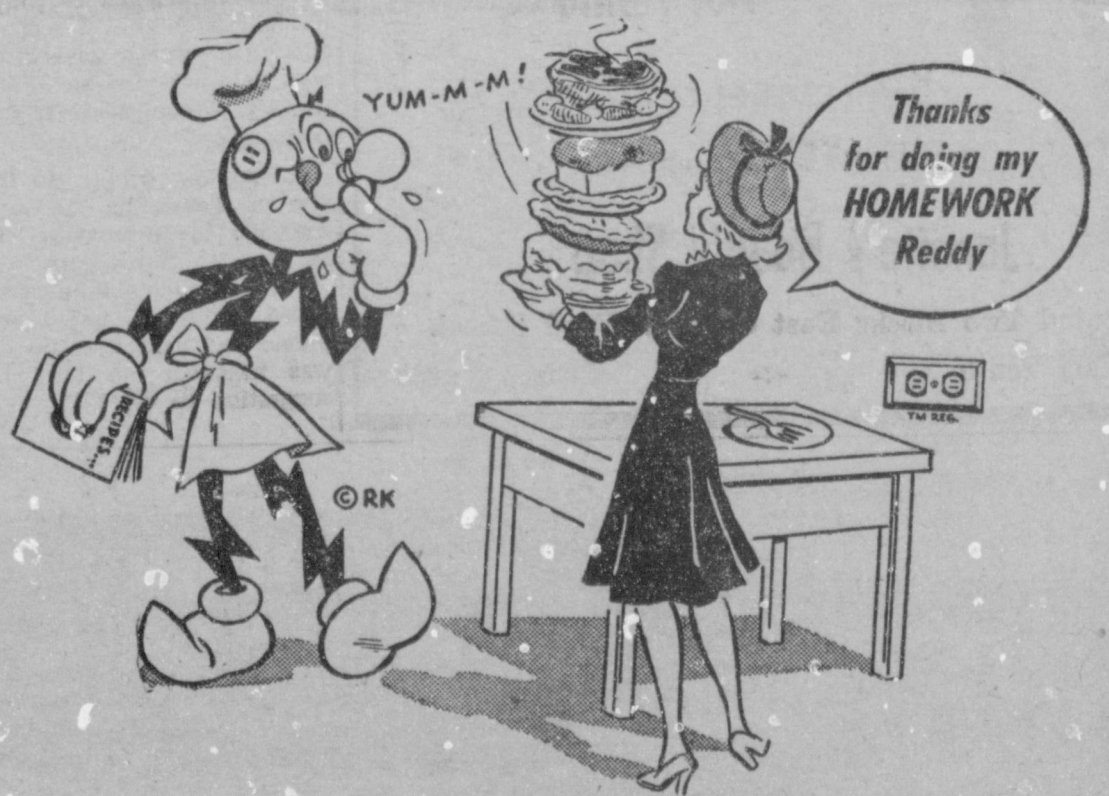
