**YOUR CAR BATTERY**

While there is no set procedure to follow in the caring for, or servicing of your battery, there are several points you should keep in mind. The most important being regular inspection: This should include:

1. Hydrometer or voltage test of each cell.
2. Checking for water level, and refilling to maintain proper amount of water.
3. Keeping top of the battery clean, to avoid "shorting" through battery straps and preventing corrosion of posts and cable terminals.
4. Cleaning and tightening cables to terminals and grounds.
5. Look the cables over for possible breaks and faulty contacts.
6. Be sure that battery is tight in carrier as vibration shortens the life of the best batteries.
7. Test the generator charging rate with all the load on to see that the output will keep the battery charged.
8. Be sure you buy a battery that is the right size and proper capacity for the work that you demand of it. Remember a little mule can pull a big load a short ways but he soon gives out. A large mule can continue for a long time pulling the same load.

bers of the Missionary Baptist church, he having been a member 78 years and she 65 years.

Recreation during their young days, consisted of singings, quittings log rollings, corn huskings, etc. Mrs. Davis said, "I enjoyed corn huskings more than anything else. They were held at night by the light of pine knots.

Mrs. Davis treasures a piece of cloth, which is 70 years old and is a piece of the riding skirt worn by her mother when she went to see the first volunteers of the Civil War. The cloth is blue, pink, white and yellow plaid, which had been spun and woven by her mother who also carded the cotton for the material. She also has a pair of pillow cases, 105 years old, made of homespun material, which she still uses at intervals. This material consists of toweling design with a lovely homemade fringe.

Every man made whiskey as he chose in those days, Mr. Davis stated, though you rarely saw a drunk man. Children were allowed to drink beer and cider during the process of whiskey making, which was usually kept in a hay loft in a barrel. They would climb the steps and were given access at any time.

All the children of this couple were present at the celebration with the exception of one. They are Mrs. Ellie Britton of Lake Arthur, New Mexico; Mrs. Florence Campbell of Briartown, Oklahoma; Uel Davis of Wortham, Texas; Charles T. Davis of Putnam.
