



From Federal Aid **Texans Benefit** 

The people of Texas have benefited the past year to the extent of \$85,139,505, which represents the national government's share in their state and local investment in health, education, and social welfare, according to a summary released today by Mr. J. H. Bond, regional director of the Federal Security Agency with headquarters in Dallas.

The figure of \$85,139,505, Mr. Bond said, includes payments under the Federal old-age and survivors insurance program and is based on preliminary data on Texas' participation in the various FSA programs. The operation of these programs is described in the forthcoming FSA Annual Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1949, to be issued by Federal Security Ad-1

ministrator Oscar R. Ewing. "Even this substantial investment," Bond pointed out, "does not tell the whole story in terms either of people or of money, since it does not take account of certain nation-wide FSA services to the state's educational system, supervision of Federal credit unions, and public health services operated directly by the Public Health Service, such as quarantines and epidemic con-

"A total of 373,110 men, women, and children in Texas benefited directly from Federal funds added to Texas investment in health, education, welfare, vocational rehabilitation, and social security. These citizens received individual benefits or services during the past year through FSA programs operating in their own communities, most of them with the co-operation of both

state and national governments." "These direct beneficiaries," he explained, "include: children who get health care, or who are dependent or in danger of becoming delinquent; the needy blind; disabled men and women being rehabilitated into jobs; old people receiving assistance; and those receiving Federal social security benefits, including both





#### Watch Out For Rheumatic Fever Warns Dr. Cox

AUSTIN, Jan. 19. - Rheumatic fever causes more deaths than any other disease in children of school age, declared Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer. The first attack usually occurs in children at the age when they are in the first or second grade and recur-rences are most common up to the age when children are leaving high school. The insidious onset of so many cases during the school year suggests that teachers and others in daily contact with school children should be aware of early signs and symptoms which may mean acute rheumatic fever.

### Gain Shown In Retail Sales For December, 1949

AUSTIN, Jan. 19 - Texas retail sales rose 22% in December from November to an estimated \$551,673,000, a 1% gain over December, 1948, the University of Texas Bureau of Business Research reported.

Sales in durable goods stores increased 2% in December from November and 3% from Dec-

ember 1948.

Jewelry stores turned in the largest November - to - December increase in durable goods sales - 169%; furniture and household goods dealers reported a 27% increase. Automotive store sales dropped 8% from the previous month, while building material, lumber, and hardware slipped 7%.

To create a sinking fund to assist in the establishment of schools and missions and to sub-sidize clinics and social centers

To create a minor seminary for the education of nativeborn Catholic priests.

To establish catechetical centers with professional teachers to meet the religious and educational needs of small and scattered communities in the rural areas of the diocese.

To establish central Diocesan Galosle for the left foot. Can get ofices for all Catholic charitable and administrative organizations.


