Burleson Invited To Partcipate In Army

Congressman Omar Burleson has been invited by officials of the Office of the Secretary of Defense Raymond Young Will and the Counsel for the Armed Services Committee of the Congress to participate in hearings and conferences on the revision and unification of military justice for he Army, Navy and Air Forces.

Congressman Burleson's invitation came as a result of his efforts and interest in modernization of court martial procedures. Congressman Burleson has been active in the promotion of such legislation since the third day he took his set in the Congress when he introduced the first Bill for this purpose, and portions of his measegislation revamping the military ustice system of the Army. As introduced, his Bill was applicable locality. to the three services, but was reected in whole by the Navy.

Congressman Burleson has long contended that the present system of military justice is outmoded and belongs to the old Prussian type of militarism. In his opinion more equal treatment of Enlisted and Officer personnel is fundamental, and legislation to bring this about is definitely needed. "There is also favoritism between the Regular Navy and Regular Army Officers and that of Reserves on active duty, because of the fraternal associations established in our Mili-




