Again, on September 19, 1949, after a second hearing on the union leaders' demands, a second Board reported to President Truno need for an additionall fireman - upon either the ground of safety or that of efficiency and economy of operation."

"Polio is a very expensive disease to treat," he said, "but no patient need go without care for lack of funds. You pay what you can afford, and your chapter, supported by the annual March of Dimes, will pay the cost of care you cannot meet"

He warned that there is no "quick cure" for polio and no way as yet to prevent it.

"With good care, most peon! get well, although some need treatmen tor a long time," he said. "More than half the persons who get the disease recover without any crippling."





From the shape and color of the sign it is possible for you to tell whether it is a REGULAT-ORY sign intended to inform upon the streets and highways, whether it is a WARNING sign erected to tell you of a hazardous condition either on or beside the road, or whether it is a Guide or Directional sign to lead you to your destination.

This is the first in a series of four articles designed to make Mr. and Mrs. Average Driver more familiar with traffic control signs, which when properly understood and obeyed, make our highways a safer place to be. This is the story of the REGULA-TORY sign.

It is important enough to repeat that REGULATORY sign is used to inform you of certain laws and regulations enacted to promote safety and convenience on streets and highways. A violation of these rules is a misdemea-

Generally, the REGULATORY sign is rectangular in shape, and it is mounted with the longer side up. The letters and borders are black, and the background is white with only the following exceptions:




