

crop will be good if the leaf and boll worms do not do too much damage. Several report they think they will make from one third to one half bale of cotton per acre, which is a good average for the crop in this territory. While a few have reported it will take seven or eight acres to make a bale.

The acreage in the territory is about the same as last year. The Putnam gin ginned about 450 bales in 1940, and it looks at present, that the town would gin 400 bales or more for the season. Putnam territory lost quite a good deal of cotton to other towns last year, but it is hoped that this cotton that has been going other places can be ginned here this season.




