

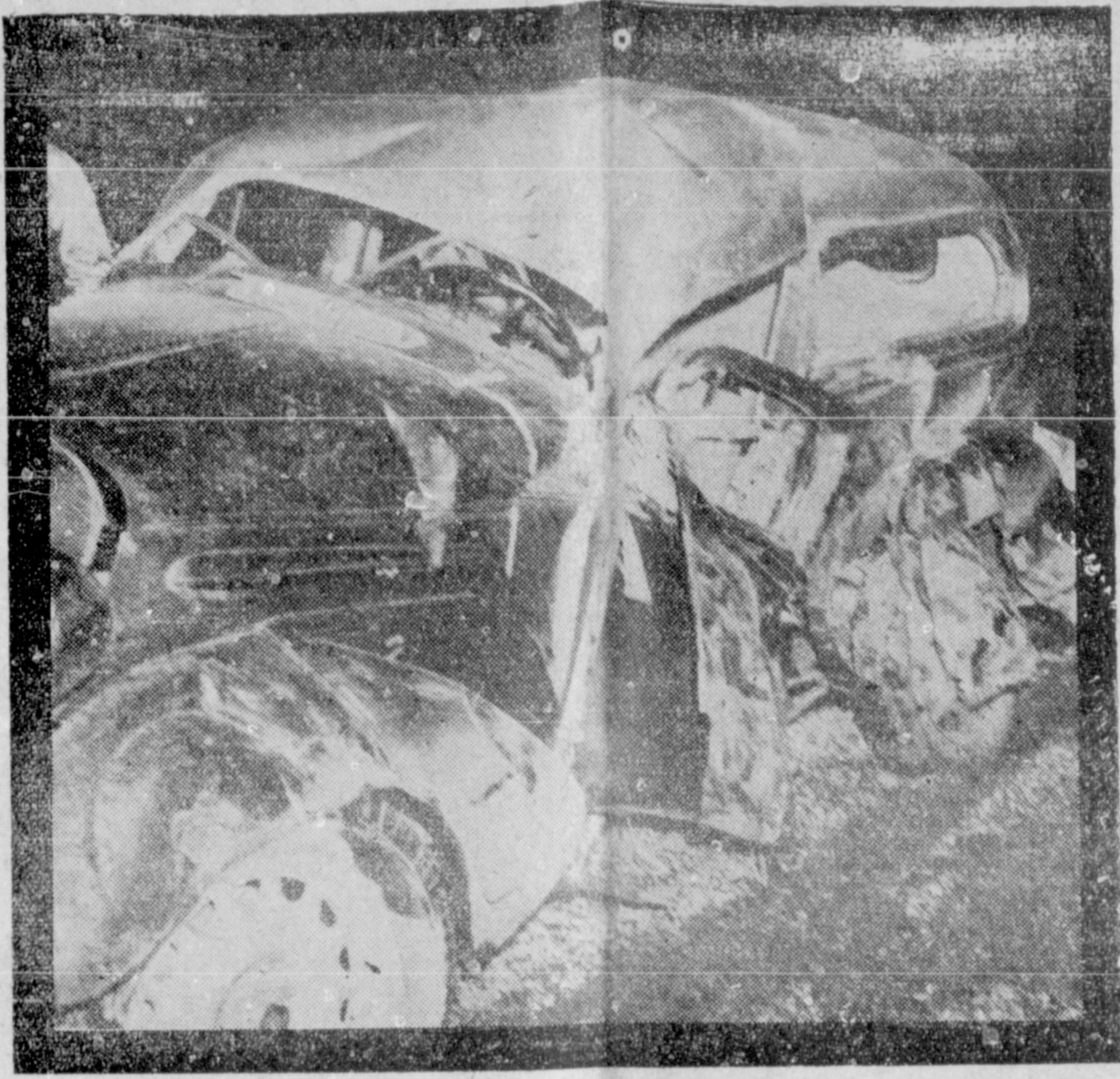
From The Editor's Window

**West Texas Fair To Open Sept. 29th Run Through Oct. 4**

**Six Miles Of Road Between Cisco And Putnam Authorized**

According to a news story in the Cisco Daily Sunday morning, rebuilding of highway 80 from three miles West of Cisco to the Callahan County line has been authorized and reconstruction will begin as soon as the right-of-way can be secured.

The program calls for an expenditure of \$188,000 on the six miles stretch. This is one of the first hard surfaced roads built in this district and is very narrow, being only 16 feet wide. The plans are to widen and eliminate two or three curves, between the over-pass over the Texas & Pacific railroad and the county line.

Also included in the project on highway 80 is \$189,000 from Baird to three miles east. Contracts will be let as soon as right-of-way has been secured and work will begin immediately.

Callahan county has one industry that it may well be proud of and that is the Octane Gas Refining plant, located about five miles east of the city of Baird on the Texas and Pacific railway. This industry was started about ten years ago and today is producing a gasoline of superior quality. The present daily output of the plant is 300,000 gallons.

The plant has an annual payroll of \$50,000.00. Owing to the care with which the drivers of all the Octane trucks exercise there is never any accidents by Octane drivers.

Callahan county has oil wells from its eastern border to the western border and the entire county is prospective territory for oil, many of the wells being shallow production, the deeper horizons not having been thoroughly explored, however, interest is now being taken in the lower stratas.
