The Texas Highway Patrol investigated nine accidents on rural highways in Hockley County during the month of July according to Sergeant H. E. Pirtle, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in no persons killed and six persons injured.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county during the first seven months of 1971 shows a total of 61 accidents resulting in two persons killed, and 51 persons injured.

The rural traffic accident summary for the 60 counties of the Lubbock Department of Public Safety Region for July, 1971 shows a total of 564 accidents resulting in 38 persons killed and 324 injured. This was 40 more accidents, 23 more fatalities, and 38 more injured than during June.

The 38 traffic deaths for the month of July, 1971 occurred in the following counties: Wise 8; Donley, 5; Wheeler 4; Lamb and Wichita 3; Oldham, Clay and Lubbock 2 each; Deaf Smith, Hall, Parmer, Potter, Archer, Dickens, King, Palo Pinto and Youne 1 each.

The 38 traffic fatalities in July have been the most that have been recorded during any month of 1971.

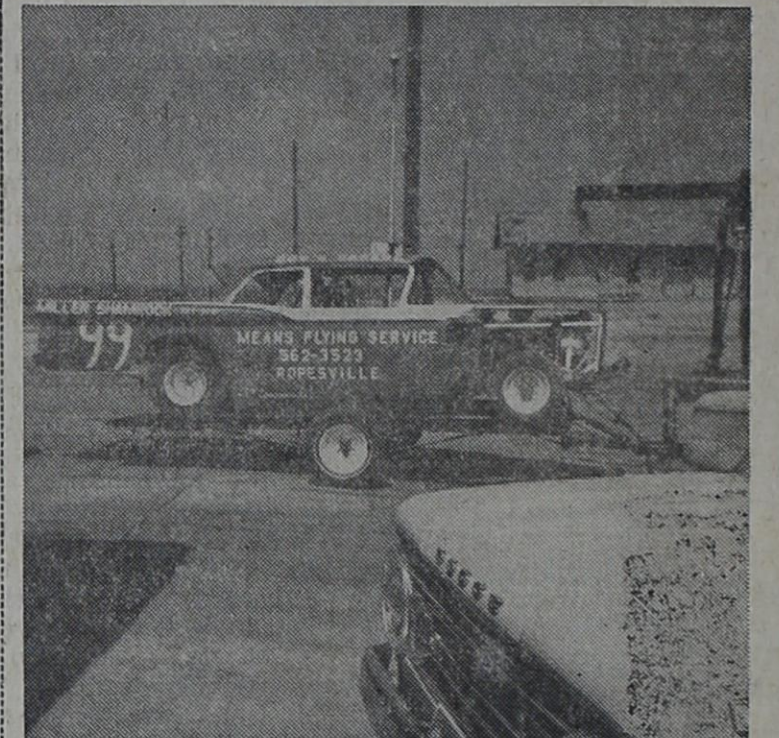
