On the night of Jan. 27, Childers was driving home when he came upon a pickup truck overturned in a cotton field south of Wolfforth. The wheels still were turning, so the wreck had just happened.

On investigation, he found that his lodge brother was pinned under the truck, soaked in gasoline dripping from the tank.

Unable after several attempts to free Wall, Childers used his new car to raise the pickup enough to remove Wall. He rushed Wall to the hospital.

Elks members said that if Childers had not performed this act of courage, Wall may have died from exposure or have burned to death if the gasoline ignited.


