Thousands of industrial plants discharge chemical wastes invo rivers and streams that previde our drinking water Many chemicals that have not been adequately tested for their effect on man are added to food in order to preserve, color, and flavor it.

A recent Railroad Commission survey shows that well over five million barrels of salt water are produced each day in Texas oil drilling operations. Some of that amount finds its way into river systems and underground water supplies, altering the chemical supply of the water.
