



Plan to serve Blueberry Bran Muffins for any meal. With the nutlike flavor and the wholesome goodness of whole bran cereal, these muffins are the not-too-sweet variety that complement every menu. Plan to make this recipe even if you're a family of only two or three. These muffins freeze nicely, and can be brought out as needed. Split, buttered and broiler-browned, they'll be a treat for a breakfast sleepyhead or a luncheon guest.

#### Blueberry Bran Muffins

21/2 teaspoons baking powder 1 cup Kellogg's Bran Buds 3/4 cup milk 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 egg 1/4 cup soft shortening 1 cup sifted regular thawed and drained all-purpose flour

1/4 cup sugar 1/2 cup frozen blueberries,

Combine Bran Buds and milk; let stand until most of moisture is taken up. Add eggs and shortening; beat well. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt and sugar; mix in blueberries. Add to Bran Buds mixture stirring only until combined. Fill greased muffin-pan cups 3/2 full. Bake in moderately hot oven (400° F.) about 25 minutes.

Yield: 10 Blueberry Bran Muffins, 21/2 inches in diameter. Note: Fresh blueberries, washed and drained, may be substi tuted for frozen.
