Raymond Dennis, County Clerk, announces that the absentee voting period for the August 5th proposed Constitutional Amendments election will start in his office on July 16, and continue through August 1st.

Those persons who expect to be absent from the County on election day (August 5th) will be permitted to vote in the Clerk's office by personal appearance. Also those persons who are already absent from the County temporarily, or those persons who are hospitalized or confined to their home will be permitted to vote absentee by mail. To be able to secure a ballot to vote by mail, whether you are absent from the County or confined in the hospital or at home, a person must mail a written request to the County Clerk giving their name, address and voters registration number.
