

### Cookies - Crisp And Coconutty



This crisp cookie, delectable with flaked coconut and pecans, is spiked with cinnamon; it's a perfect accompaniment to tea for the grown-ups, milk for the youngsters, or just for good eating any time. For a change, chill this cookie dough until it can be handled easily; then form into small balls and place on greased baking sheets. Flatten with the bottom of a glass dipped in flour. Bake as for drop cookies.

Coconut Crisps

2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon double-acting

1/2 cup butter or margarine

1 tablespoon cinnamon

1 cup granulated sugar

baking powder 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar 2 eggs

1 tablespoon milk 1/2 cup finely chopped pecams 11/3 cups (about) flaked coconut

Sift flour with baking powder, soda, and cinnamon. Cream butter, gradually add sugars, and cream until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat well; then add flour mixture. Add milk and blend well. Add pecans and coconut. Drop from teaspoon onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 375° for 10 to 12 minutes, or until lightly browned. Makes about 5 dozen cookies.
