THIS WEEK IN AUSTIN Action of the 56th Legis-
lature, overshadowed by the
big issue of state finances,
has produced some new measures that will effect fiv major changes in Texas.
Truck weight limits raised from 58,420 pounds to 72,000 pounds.
Police and firemen will work shorter hours. Control of loan sharks will be sought through a proposed amendment to the Constitu-
tion. Voters will consider tion. Voters will consider
allowing the Legislature to set interest rates on loans. In the field of higher education, two junior colleges were raised to senior rank. Midwestern University was a new medical branch of the University of Texas was
founded at San Antonio, and the first step was taken to bring endowment-rich University of Houston into the state system as a University of Texas branch. The Texas election laws
have been altered, advancing the July-August primaries to May-June, with the dead line for candidates filing to ruary. Credit for this action is being given backers of
Senator Lyndon Johnson for presidential nomination. Probably the most important of all the above actions is the "loan shark" resolu-
tion which will be submitted to the voters for approval in the general election of 1960.

If passed, the constitu-
tional amendment will give the Legislature the authority to classify loans and lenders, define interest and fix maximum rates of interest. The purpose would be to allow the lawmakers to set a rate of interest on small loans constitutional limit of 10 per cent. This can be done only by specific legislation and
does not remove the constitutional limit except as specified by the legislation, say legal observers Action would be taken by the Legislatu

Section 1. This entire ordinance is and shall be deemed an exercise of the police power of the State of Texas, and of the City of Ropesville, for the pubirc safety and protection of the thereof and all of the provisions herein shall be construed for the accomplishment of that purpose.
Section 2. From and after the passage and first publication hereof, it shall be unlawful for any person to vehicle operate a motor
uny street, roadway, or highway in the City Limits of the City of Ropesville, at a greater rate of speed than 30 miles per hour, except where speed zone signs are wected indicating a higher or lower rate of speed in which case the speed indicated by the speed zone shall be the maximum speed permitted, and it shall be unlawful for and shall to operate a moto vehicle in excess to the speed limit In excess to the speed limit indicated on any official speed zone sign.

Any person vio-
lating any provision of this
suilty or shall de deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum of not less than $\$ 5.00$ and not more than $\$ 100.00$.
