termine cause of the accident and prevent additional ones in the future. It is
possible that success or faipossible that success or fai-
lure of an entire weapon system could be at stake due to such carelessness by persons at the scene of the ac-
ident.
The Air Force has been
able to consistently reduce able to consistently reduce
its major aircraft accident rate through expeditious work of aircraft accident in vestigation officers who ar-
rive at the scene of accidents as rapidly as possibe
Their on-the-scene investiTheir on-the-scene investi-
