

State law requires that cars, original equipment. trucks, and certain trailers be inspected at an approved inspection station, and that a current inspection sticker be displayed in the lower right-hand corner of the windshield by midnight, April 15. The fee for the inspection is \$1.75, plus charges made by the inspection station for adjustments, if any




