The climax of the program will come this Fall with the Thanksgiving - Harvest Festival and the final commitment of all proceeds from the program to the building fund. Fund For Reconciliation To Be Presented

At the uniting conference in Dallas in 1968 when the United Brethren Church and The Methodist Church became one body the group approved as part of its quadrennial program a \$20,000,000 FUND FOR RECONCILIATION. This action came about to help meet "the crisis in the nation" resulting from the needs in Vietnam, race riots and protests at home, and the ever mounting problems of poverty and inequality. Today, hundreds of organized works of reconciliation are being supported by the fund.

With Annual Conference coming May 24 - 27 for the Northwest Texas Annual Conference the constituent churches are being asked to make a worthy contribution to the FUND FOR RECONCILIATION. The work of reconciliation that this and other connectional funds support will be a highlight of the Annual Conference in Amarillo. Reverend Harry Hines from the New York office of the United Methodist Committee for Overseas Relief will be the feature speaker for this special emphasis Wednesday evening, May 26.

Accordingly, our church will observe Sunday, May 23 as Reconciliation Sunday with an appropriate worship service and special offering.

The next meetings of the Fellowship Discussion Groups will be Wednesday evening, May 26. The proposal by the Consultation on Church Union for a plan of union will be the subject for discussion. Every member family of the church has a booklet containing the complete PLAN OF UNION for them at the church if it has not been picked up already.
