Freedom In Truth

"Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free"

Jno. 8:32

For the next several weeks we will be studying from the Love chapter of the New Testament - the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians. In this study we will learn that love for God and our fellowman must be the basis of all our deeds, as Christians, or they will all be in vain. Before we enter into this study, let us point out that we are taught, "To love God with all thy heart, soul and mind" and that we are "to love thy neighbor as thyself". Matt. 22:36-39. On these two principles all the law, and all the prophets said, hung. On these two principles all that is taught in the gospel of Christ depends.

In the first verses of First Corinthians, thirteen, Paul states: (1) If he could speak with all the tongues of men or angels, and did not do so with love, for God and man, it would be an empty sound. (2) If he had

the gift of prophecy, knew all mysteries, had all knowledge, and all faith, so as to be able to remove mountains, and had not love, he would be nothing. (3) If he gave all he had to feed the poor and even gave his body to be burned and had not love, it would not profit him a thing. These statements should make all of us pause and think. Do we LOVE to serve God and our fellow man? If we attend the worship of God without love, it will do us no good. If we give without love, it does not profit us a thing. It may help the hungry, warm the cold, but it will not be to our heavenly account. In the last verse of this chapter Paul says, "But now abideth faith, hope, and love, these three; and the greatest of these is love." Love is the expression of faith, and without love there can be no hope, therefore the greatest of these is LOVE. Next week we will learn what love does. THINK on these things.

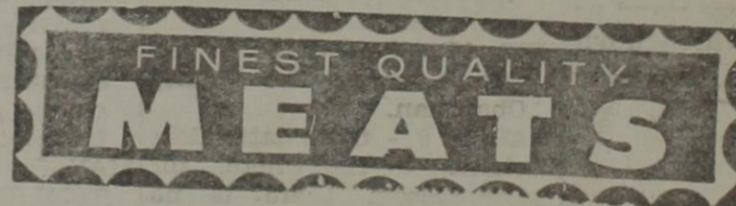
