| Clouds which only dumped a recorded half inch of rain in Ropes proper last Sunday night is reported to have done devastating damage to the crops at Lockettvilie, approximately ten miles west of Ropes. <br> Mrs. Skeet Roberson reported that while the hail was only marble size, it cut the crops, trees and shrubbery to pieces The hail seemingly was only over a small strip with the Lockett farms suffering the most damage. <br> High winds were reported, and it is said that many farmers lost several acres of crops from the wind and some of the crops were burned from the sand. <br> On Saturday night, in Ropes the winds hit with a velocity of about fifty miles an hour, would let up to where the leavs on the trees | didn't even move, and then hit again.
