

Congressman George Mahon returned to the District recently following "a rugged" and historic sesion of Congress which set a modern record of 383 roll call votes in the House and the passage of 85 pieces of major legislation" Mahon, who was present for all of the roll call votes, said. "The impact of the legislation enacted in this Congress will be felt for generations. I opposed some of it; I support ed some."

Mahon, who played a key role during the session of Congress as Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, which provides legislation for funds folr all government programs, says he feels that the country needs to pause and undertake to digest the huge amount of legislation which has been passed." We need to avoid legislative indigestion, as one who eats too much too fast, and I am anticipating a shorter sesson next year, with a less amount of legislation. It is going to take some time to evaluate the legislation we have passed this year. Refinement and modification will be in order."

Mahon pointed out that the ultimate success or failure of much of the legislation, including the Farm Bill, will depend on how well the programs are administered by the Executive Branch.

The Congressman expressed pleasure at being home a gain and indicated his intention to spend as much time as possible between now and the next session of Congress out among the people of the 20-county District. His staff will be in charge of his Lubbock and Washington offices pending the recovening of Congress in January The Lubbock office is in the Post Office Building.
