



Remove paper carton wrap from ice cream. Place ice cream in large bowl. Let stand at room temperature for 15 to 20 minutes. Stir with a spoon until the ice cream is of a smooth spreading consistency. If ice cream is too soft, return to the freezer for a few, minutes. Cut each cake layer horizontally through the center. This will make four thin layers. Work as quickly as possible; spread 1/3 of the softened ice cream over a layer of cake. Repeat procedure ending with a cake layer on top. Place cake in freezer until ice cream is very firm; about one hour. Whip cream with vanilla extract. Remove cake from freezer. Quickly spread or swirl whipped cream over sides and top of cake. Sprinkle chopped nuts over sides of cake. With pastry tube and plain tip, pipe whipped. cream around top and bottom borders of cake. If desired, decorate with glace cherries and walnut halves.


