## First Load of Milo Arrives in Ropes

The first load of Milo maize was marketed at the Ropes Grain Corp. August 9 by Kenneth Means. The load was weighed in at 10:30 a.m., and the moisture content tested 15.25. It was of the R-10 variety and was planted on April 11. It was yielding 1500 pounds per acre.

This load of grain is about eight days earlier than the first load marketed in 1961 by E. N. Exum.

Charles Shannon, manager of the Ropes Grain Corp., stated Kenneth would be paid a bonus price for the grain.

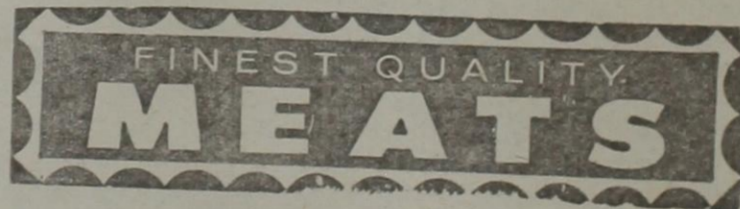
