PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 1957.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEG-ISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
