



The worst aspect of this bill is the stifling of private enter prise. No company can compete against a government organiza tion. True, REA will insist that they pay taxes, but they do not on a par with a private concern. They do not pay federal taxes; they pay an especially low state tranchise tax, and they do not pay county taxes the same rate as private power companies. If you are worried about your taxes today, go to the courthouse, city hall and school tax office, and see what added burden you would have if there were no private utilities paying taxes in your community.
