#### WHAT MAKES ELECTIONS PURE

Although the proposal to abolish the Texas poll tax failed to carry last November, the issue is far from settled. As often happens, it was a small minority that voted to maintain the tax on the ballot. In the state-wide referendum held earlier in which a heavy vote was registered, a large majority favored abolition of the tax. The proposal last November failed simply because only about one of each five voters took time to go to the polls.

Now that a federal amendment prohibits payment of a poll ax in any election, primary or general, involving a federal office. . . President, Vice President, U. S. Senator, Congressman. . the need for abolition of the tax in the handful of states that

gill have it is even more acute. Attempts to maintain this tax will be about as successful as

attempts to maintain slavery in 1860. . . or school segregation

Opponets of abolition in Texas advanced many hair-raising casons for maintaining the poll tax. They forecast "corrupt solitics" if the masses were allowed to vote free. They predicted errible things, such as a "labor take over." "Mexican-Negro toalition" and the like.

But this problem can be seen in clearer prospective if we consider the fact that only five states, all Southern, now main ain the poll tax. And these states. . . Alabama, Arkansas, Missssippi, Virginia and Texas. . . aren't exactly paragons of political responsibility and governmental integrity. We'd say we're in pretty sorry company! It appears to be one of those "everybody's out of step but Johnny" things.

It seems that the problem arising from the 24th amendment to the federal constitution are just beginning. Virginia and Texas have already provided for "dual elections," meaning that when both state and federal elections are held on the same day. . . like in the party primaries and general elections. . . there will have to be two or even three registration lists (federal only, state only, federal and state together), two or three seperate ballots, voting-machine adjustments where they have voting machines, and seperate counts for the poll tax paying and non poll tax paying voter. This might be a weapon to use in fighting the unemployment problem. . . . but unfortunately it offers only temporary relief once every two years.

Virginia has gone Texas one better. In a special session last November, the Virginia General Assembly arranged for a substitute to the poll tax to go into effect the mornent the 24th amendment became law. Those who wish to vote in a federal election in Virgrinia without paying the poll tax must now file a "certificate of residency" six months before the election takes place. The General Assembly refused to entertain the suggestion that those who so file be given receipts. And without a receipt the voter cannot prove he has filed a certificate in case some question about his eligibility should arise at the

Of course, if he pays the poll tax, he is automatically registered to vote in all elections, federal, state and local.But while the tax is nothing very much to pay, the trick is that it must be paid for three consecutive years preceding an election in order to guarantee eligibility. The Byrd machine, it must be understood, is as much concerned about the voting habits of the




