Srom the Exchanges of the Slatonite

THIS CIVIL RIGHTS issue reminds us of New Testement Christianity vs. Old Testament law. The new Testament law of love for God and one's fellowmen actually made uncessary the Ten Commandements in that love for God and for one's neighbors prevents one from vie ating any of the Old Testament Commandements.

We couldn't care less because we have a law on the books forbidding murder (only in that it might cause us to feel more secure). We have no plans to kill, whether killing is legal or illegal.

Likewise, we couldn't care less whether the Civil Rights bill passes - whether it does or not, we plan to live by its principles.

No person who wants only to do what's right towards his fellowman, who is not prejudiced against race, color, or creed, has any fear of the Civil Rights bill. The only person who will be offended by the bill is he who would say, in effect, "You are as qualified as a white, you are as clean as a white, in fact you have every qualification fro the job . . but I won't hire you because of the color of your skin."

There is nothing in the bill which suggests that an unpualified man would have to be employed, that an obnoxious person would have to be employed.

In discussing progress in politics, much has been said about growing federal power cutting in on the rights of states to handle their own affairs.

While the point is well taken, states righters and other antagonists of federal authority would do well to make a re-appraisal of their own func-

It's' certain centralization in Washington is an issue but it's equally true that many one-time state functions have been abdicted for lack of knowhow and efficiency on the local level.

In that connection, our system of political subdivisions should be reevaluated with an eye toward merging certain functions now seperatedby county and city government and even state and county authority.

Doing away with multiple, duplicating functions would result in monetary savings to hardpressed small unit governments and at the same time would release more funds to help finance projects now threatened by a take-over from Washing-
