The Yule log in England is a relle of Druldism. Its name is considered a corruption of "wheel log," a wheel
in Druldical symbolism typifying the In Druldical symbolism typifying the
march of the sun. The lighting of the Yule log harks back to the sacred fires kindled by the Drulds at mid-
winter in the round towers which yet winter in the round towers which yet
remain in many parts of Great Britremaln in many parts of Great Brit-
aln, Ireland, France and Spain. The
an use of the Christmas tree has descend-
ed from the German Drulds. The dreasing of the tree with candles and presents was a feature of their mild-
winter festival.
Ivy is not used for Christunas dec
orations, as it was once sacred to
 sole leafy adornment at the Roman
saturnalla. The early Christian clergy

If one has any talent for carpentry, even of the roughest sort, an effective
support can be made by nalling two pleces of wood in the shape of

this and nalling cleats to both tree and support until it stands frmly. A very pretty effect can be obtained

and the floor directly around it with white cotton batting on which silver tinsel, called "rain" in most shops, has been sprinkled. This makes the tree
