Protection of food supply by keeping food covered and inaccesible to Flies, Rats and Mice. Dishe should be washed in hot, soapy water, or sterilizer. Purchase no spoiled or contaminated food stuff for human consumption.
4. Control of rats and mice. Keep food away from rats. Place baited traps in run-ways, close up rat openings. Support community-wide rat poisoning campaigns.
5. Control of Mosquito Breeding. Examine premises closely for standing water in cans, bottles and other artificial containers. Destroy all mosquito-breeding placer.
