### About the Liberty

The government is making special effort to get the Liberty Loan bonds into the hands of all citizens, and to his end we will endeavor to tell you just what they are.

A Liberty Loan bond is a solemn promise of the United States to pay at maturity the amount of the bond to the holder thereof, and to pay interest semiannually each year from the date of the issuance of the bond until it is fully and finally paid. The security behind the bonds is the United States itself. The bonds bear the date of June 15, 1917, and are to run thirty years, except that the Government reserves the right to pay them fifteen years after date. If this right is not exercised by the Government fifteen years from date, the bonds will run the full thirty years.

These bonds bear interest at the rate of 32 per cent per annum, and the interest is payable semi-annually on the fifteenth day of December and the fifteenth day of June in each year.

The bonds are nontaxable, and this makes them equivalent to
