

Be it clearly understood that the drama of the Barnyard had its origin at the State Agriculture & Mechanical College. The Food Administration for Texas expresses, however, the keenest interest in the placing upon the market of a probable 10,000,000 dozen eggs during the period named, and all of them infertile. Placing the value of these eggs at 20 cents a dozen, which is very low, there would be a saving to Texas alone of \$2,000,000.

It has also been suggested, and very well to, that capons make an excellent dish and that Rooster Stew and Chanticleer pie are viands to be devoutly wished. The program of the Agriculture Department does involve the saving of millions of eggs, and the saving is reasonable and logical at a time when every ounce of food is necessary to the nation.

The chief difference between fertile and infertile eggs is presence and the extremity of absence"; the former will spoil even under the best care and attention, while under ordinary circumstances the infertile eggs will keep in good condition.

Fertile eggs begin to incubate

and deteriorate under a temperature of 68 degrees or above; therefore it is easy to understand that it is impossible to keep eggs in a temperature above 68 degrees, under average farm conditions. Seventy percent of the loss of eggs under summer conditions in Texas, is due to the production of fertile eggs.


