## Lower Rates Are Charged

Lower rates are charged for Station-toStation calls when placed between the hours of 8:30 p. m. and 12:00 midnight. The rate during that time is about one half the Stationto-Station day rate, and is known as the Evening Rate.
This class of service is very popular for social calls. The charges cannot be reversed, however, on Station-to-Station calls. Neither is the evening rate effective when the day rate is 25 c or less. On such short haul messages, the day rate applies.
