

The renter wants to be free from the unreasonable rates he is often orced to pay because of the law of supply and demand. He wants the andlord to furnish a reasonable amount of conveniences for him to use while in charge of the property.

If the landlord would hold his rents at a reasonable figure all the time, he would more nearly keep his property rented all the time. If he would always be fair with the rente when demand is heavy, the renter would not desert him so quickly when lemand is light.

If the renter would take care of the property he uses, his rents would not cost so heavily, because the cost of upkeep would be less to the land lord. If the renter would pay his rents regularly, and never try to avoid just payments, the landlord would have another reason to reduce his price. If the renter would take an interest in the property as if it was his own e would be a desirable renter to an






