

VERY STATE NOW HAS PULSORY ATTENDANCE LA

Tendency To Raise Upper Limit-In 32 States Children must Attend Entire School Term

When Mississippi enacted its in itial law on the subject in 1918 it was the last of the 48 states to pass a law requiring the attendance of hildren at school. Some of these laws are not yet very strong but the tendency is to make them stronger as time passes and experience points he way. For example, a dozen years ago hardly a state required attendance above the age of 14. Now 32 states fix 16 as the age which attendance must continue, unless certain prescribed conditions have been previously met; and seven other states fix the ages higher than sixteen as the up er limit.

The prevailing lower age limit is for 27 states name this as the age or beginning required attendance. In vo states 6 is the lower limit. Cleary the present standard in America i hat children between the ages of and 16 must go to school.

The attendance required each yea an important element in a compulory education law. Exactly three ourths of the states require attenance for the full public-school term. In only two cases is the minnimum equirement less than 100 days annually.

Of the 32 states requiring attenlance to the age of 16 under certain conditions a number make the rejuirement absolutely up to 14, but atendance between that age and 16 is intingent upon educational attain The standard which would seem to be taking definite form here s this: That the child must attend chool until the age of sixteen is at-


