> inal list. There is a total of pending cases of 372, and in the ten weeks of court there are 60 work days. It would be necessary to try and dispose of more than six cases a day in order to clean up the present docket. Very seldom can a case be tried in less than a day and sometimes one case requires one to two weeks, or more.

The civil docket includes even fifty divorce cases, which is nearly nineteen per cent of all the civil cases, showing that the prevalency of divorce in Lubbock County is in line with the rest of the country, and also indicates that divorce in this section, as elsewhere, is on the increase.
