Baptists To Ask For Aid For Sick

Baptist churches throughout Texas will observe Mother's Day Mother's Day Hospital Fund collection to provide charity care for the needy sick in the five Baptist hospitals of che state.
Sunday schools, church congregations and all church organizations will participate with every
member invited to make a gift to the sick poor as a personal tribute in honor or in memory, of his own mother.
In the initial collection last year,
Iexas Baptists gare $\$ 30,000$. All gifts are used solely for giving free hospitalization to critically ill patients in need of hospital such treatment. The five Baptist hospitals are Hendrick Memorial Hospital, Abilene; Baylor University Hospital, Dallas; Valley Baptist Hospital; Memorial Hospital, Houston; and Hillerest Memorial Hospital, Waco. Patints cared for from all parts of the state and need not be Baptists nor of any
denomination. denomination.
