

Preserve Saplings

Fresh-cut saplings to be used for farm posts or poles will drink enough chemical solution to prolong their length of service. The solution can be made from two pounds of zinc chloride, chromated zinc chloride, or copper sulphate to each gallon of water. A half gallon of the solution will treat a four-inch pole which is 30 feet long. The bottoms of posts or poles are placed in a tank or tub of the solution, which is poisonous to livestock or human beings.
