



Brooder Light For Chicks
One electric light placed either in the brooder house or under the chick brooder hover will cut out a lot of the crowding that kills many small chicks each year. The light tends to keep the chickens from piling up when they get too hot or too cold, or are frightened. A 15- to 25-watt bulb is all that is needed. 




