| Business firms are planning special programs to stimulate volume during Natonai Air Mail Week October 27-November 2, Postmaster Scudder declared today. <br> Inauguration of the new fivecent United States flag rate Oct. 1 immediately brought a sharp rise in nir mail volume. Rapid air mail service, offered for the first time at a low postage rate, should stimulate commerce, business leaders here believe. For that reason, they are encouraging large air-mailings during the nation-wide mail promotion week. <br> "We have long advocated lower air mail rates," said Mr. Scudder, "believng that rapid service between customers and manufacturers and distributors would foster commerce. <br> "The Post Office Department has taken a leaf from the book of American business, reducing the air-mail rate from 8 cents to 5 | cents an ounce and simaltaneousiy The better and faster service. proven principle that by getting more customers for a good product at a reduced cost the unit cost of delivery is cut. A lower price requires one thing to succeed-larger volume. <br> "Business men want to have the five-cent rate continued. A policy of enlightened self-interest suggests that all of us promote air mail during this period when the new low rate is being tested." <br> Meanwhile, Postmaster Soudder reported, air mail letters are being recelved at the post office with incorrect postage affixed. The fivecent rate applies anywhere that the American flag files, including all United States possensions. It is also applicable to the armed forces abroad, and to Canada and Mexico. |
