New Liquid Type **Defoliant Proves** Effective In Test

THE EAST IN

De-leaf No. 2 with an added chemical, a new discovery, definitely got results.

Liquid spray defoliant was applied by King and Moore Aerial Dust and Spray Service to four one-acre plots of cotton thru the cooperation of the Lubbock Experiment Station, the chemicals being supplied by O. K. Tex Chemical Co. The Experiment Station was interested only in the results and does not endorse any product. Of the four tests made the one using De-leaf No. 2 with the added chemical proved effective. Several farmers have seen the result and have asked for the defoliant. Mr. Jim Moore called the factory and told them what had been found and they sent out a shipment of De-leaf No. 2, which King and Moore are authorized to sell for perial or ground spraying equipment. Mr. Moore says type of soil, as well as weather conditions makes a difference in the effectiveness of a defoliant. He says De-leaf No. 2, which is effective here, might not work in another section where soil types differ.

According to Mr. Moore dust has been the best defoliant for use here until this new discovery was made, but only if weather conditions were ideal, which meant very heavy dew. He cites an example from last year when he started defoliation dusting under ideal conditions on Oct. 6 and had no more dew until Oct. 18 for completion of the job. Dust is impractical here due to those circumstances, he says.

Farm Life And Methods In This Area Have Changed Through The Years

Like the old gray mare, farming in this area "ain't what it used to be." Times have changed and with them farm life and methods. General farming is on the way out in favor of specialization. In the good old days every farmer raise deterpthing. He milked up to a dozen cows, raised some beef cattle and raised his own pigs. He kept a big flock of chickens and sold broilers and fryers as well as eggs.

Now farmers are finding that they can realize much more profit by putting cotton or other money crops in the acreage required to raise feed to support a large herd of milk cows and also can save work. Those who still raise beef cattle are for the most part specializing in that field and raising only beef cattle. Most farmers now keep only enough cows to provide fresh milk, cream, and butter of their own use, and some are going farther than that. A number of farmers have sold all their cows and are buying milk and butter. Many farmers in this area "still raise enough produce to last the round but little canning is being done. Most of the food is processed for quick freezing and stored in home deep freeze units or put in the locker plant.






