Friday night the team went to Claude to play four very rough games. The Junior Varsity girls







Cockrell Seeks County Judges's Position

Longtime County resident and area businessman Lee Υ. Cockrell announced today he will compete in the March 1998 Republican Primary for the office of Carson County Judge.

Cockrell said he wants to be the next Carson County Judge. It's time for a change, he said. "I believe all Americans should be willing to and serve contribute something back to society if they have the ability and qualifications to do the job. I feel that I can make a difference in Carson County

government by offering conservative new leadership with business experience."

Cockrell has been a self-employed farmer and businessman in Carson County for the past 45 years. He pays taxes in three counties. He has founded and served as chairman of the board of four profitable corporations and has been president or budget director in several associations and

organizations. He was born and raised at Pampa, Texas, where he was taught hard work has rewards while working as a kid on the

Carson family farms and ranches. At age 12 he could drive a tractor eight hours and was paid with a patch of wheat and three mother cows.

> At Pampa High he was inducted into the National Honor Society in 1952. That year after graduation he borrowed money to go into business and moved to Carson County where he started farming 960 acres on a share That fall he crop. started working his way through four years of college while farming and training roping horses for top pro ropers.

At Hardin Simmons University he took two years of Bible and military science and was promoted to a squad leader the first year in Reserve Officers Training. He won the University its only National Championship when he became the collegiate National Champion calf roper. At Texas Tech he studied law, finance, accounting, and business management. He says,

"My most important lessons were taught by my parents and grandparents - do the right thing, help people when you can, say NO to drinking and smoking,

work hard for what you want to accomplish, support church and country, and be willing to take a stand for what you believe in."

Cockrell has been a member of the First



Christian Church since he was 14 years old. He joined the Masonic Lodgewhen he was 24 years old.

At age 46 he went back to college and got his real estate license. In 1992 Cockrell was inducted into the Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame.

Cockrell has three daughters and three grandsons and believes we all should get more

involved in the political process for the future of our children and our country. He says, "I have given a lot of

thought about my decision to seek the county judge post. I have the education.



Britten added 2. McLean won by 34 to Groom's 21 after a very close battle.



McLean School Launches Kids For Wish Kids Program


